Questions	
Example: Which statement summarizes the central idea of the selection?	In paragraph 3, what effect does the word generously have on the selection?
What is the effect of the metaphor in the sentence below from paragraph 4? “Only, at the time, the prestige attached to the journey was such that those who did not leave attempted to justify themselves by discrediting those who did—the long-suffering sippers who had found themselves obliged to swallow the salty caviar of exile.”	What is the effect of the phrase below from paragraph 4 on the overall selection? “the long-suffering sippers who had found themselves obliged to swallow the salty caviar of exile.”
What is the purpose of the figurative language in the sentence below from the last paragraph? “In 2002, the difference between those who left and those who stayed no longer attracted capital letters (for we live in a lowercase era, without great pretensions).”	Which statement describes the connection between the selection and the oxymoron “both at the same time”?
What can be inferred from the author’s focus on Argentina’s troubled past and present situation?	In the excerpt from “To the Person Leaving”, why does the author choose to end the selection with a rhetorical question?

Answer Strategies

<p>Example: Return to the text. Briefly explain what the text is mostly discussing. Read all answer choices. Determine which choice most closely resembles central idea you determined.</p>	<p>Return to the text. Identify the rhetorical question. Determine how the rhetorical question affects the reader. Identify the author's purpose. Explain how/what that question contributes to the text.</p>
<p>Return to the text. Identify the figurative language in the paragraph. Identify what the figurative language is. Determine the meaning of the figurative language. Determine how/what the figurative language contributes to the text.</p>	<p>Return to the text. Read the paragraph containing the phrase. Explain what the phrase means from the selection. Determine how it relates to the text/what would change without it.</p>
<p>Return to the text. Identify the metaphor within the paragraph. Explain the meaning of the metaphor. Determine how it relates to the text/what would change without it.</p>	<p>Return to the text. Identify what information author is giving about the past/present. Determine what the author's purpose is based on given information. Determine what implicit information is being given through the explicit text.</p>
<p>Return to the text. Identify where the phrase is located within the text. Determine the meaning of the oxymoron. Explain how the text relates back to the oxymoron.</p>	<p>Return to the text. Find the word in the text. Read the sentence with the word and other surrounding sentences. Use context clues to determine the meaning. Identify how that word changes the meaning of the sentence.</p>
